Letter from the Chair



At present I am privileged to be able to serve on the Trenton Memorial Hospital - Implementation Task Force (TMH-ITF). This was struck by the SE LHIN in January 2016 to further address the report that came out of the Brighton Quinte West Health Services Advisory Committee (BQWSAC). This latter committee (which I also participated in) worked for about 7 months evaluating the issues with patient care and health services in this area. A detailed evaluation was undertaken of population trends and dynamics, as well as a developed understanding of the Ministry of Health and Long Term Care amendments to the funding formula. This resulted in the recommendation to protect the hospital services as they currently exist and to consider the development of what has become commonly referred to as a Health Hub.

The major development coming from the BQWSAC was the recognition that several health care providers have overlaps or duplications as well as possible gaps in delivery. Communication and co-ordination are issues that often are the centres of frustration and complaints. The "Health Hub Model" attempts to identify and address the integration of service delivery.

One of the tools that may help in the integration of services delivered is consideration of co-location. Because there is available space at the Trenton Memorial Hospital site, this facility is being evaluated to determine the viability of locating some of the health care services at the hospital. What this would mean is that the hospital would remain and underutilized space would be designated for community health care agencies.

Stay tuned as we continue to work on the many complex issues surrounding health care in the 21st century.

Saves Taxes - Save Our Hospital

To the incredible supporters of the Trenton Memorial Hospital Foundation. I feel as the Treasurer of TMHF it is important what stewardship we undertake relating to the gifts you have made to TMHF. We have received incredible support over the years from direct gifts to the Foundation as well as through monthly contributions and bequests left through estates. These gifts are not all required to meet our annual commitment or needs to funding essential medical equipment for Trenton Memorial Hospital

each year when funds are received. As such these funds are invested through Scotia Asset Management to insure that annual needs can be met when needs outstrip revenue received on a yearly basis. We undertake the process of managing our investments very seriously, and meet a minimum of 2x a year with our investment advisors to discuss allocations of the investment and our performance. Part of this review process was to undertake a very exhaustive analysis of entire approach to investment management in 2013 and 2014 with us electing in consultation with our investment advisors to alter significantly our approach to asset allocation. This process notwithstanding the first few months, has proven to be quite fortuitous and we have experienced very positive rates of return during the past 18 months and we believe the approach to active management undertaken by our investment advisors and a much more global view of the investment universe that we have available as a Foundation will allow us to meet the every developing needs of Trenton Memorial Hospital. This will provide essential medical equipment and significant assets to fund the future of Trenton Memorial Hospital and its expanding health care role to the residents of Quinte West and Brighton.

Donations of securities (whether they be mutual funds, individual stocks or bonds) can have a significant positive impact on both the charity that receives the gift, but also you, as the donor. You can transfer shares or other investments that you own directly to the Trenton Memorial Hospital Foundation and you will receive full value for the investments transferred in terms of a charitable receipt. Perhaps even more importantly there is no capital gain to be paid on the assets transferred. Members of the Board of TMHF and other local financial advisors have helped a number of donors in this process, yielding significant benefits for both. For example if you owned shares that were worth \$50,000 that you had originally paid \$25,000 on and donated the cash, while you would receive the charitable receipt for the \$50,000 donation, you would have to pay capital gains on the \$25,000 you realized on the sale of the investments above what you originally paid for them. Conversely if you donated the shares directly you get the same charitable contribution but pay no taxes on the transfer of the assets. If you were in a 40% tax bracket, the impact is a tax savings of \$5,000 in the year of donation. Why not explore this option with your financial advisor or members of the TMHF board? The benefit of making the gift while you are alive is you can earmark the money for a specific purpose or provide essential capital to insure the long term viability of our Hospital.

Changes at TMHF and Leaving Future Gifts

Trenton Memorial Hospital Foundation is a non-profit, charitable corporation incorporated under the laws of the Province of Ontario. It was set up initially to be the fundraising

and donation receiving arm of Trenton Memorial Hospital. Since the amalgamation with Quinte Healthcare Corporation, the TMH Foundation has continued to operate in that capacity for the Trenton Memorial site.

In December, 2013, the TMH Foundation applied for and received a change to its Letters Patent which permitted the Foundation to support other registered charities that provide medical and health services to residents of Quinte West and Brighton. Previously, funds donated could only be used within the actual hospital.

While it is still possible to make donations or bequests specifically for use in the hospital, after December 13th, 2013, unrestricted gifts may be applied to outside charitable healthcare services, at the discretion of the Board of Directors of the Foundation.

If you have made a bequest to the hospital in your Will, and wish the Foundation to have the ability to support medical and health services outside the hospital, it is recommended that you amend your Will accordingly.
